Womankind a "Lifesaver" for this Art Teacher

It was July of 2021 when Marissa Adams, then a training coordinator with Chick-fil-A, learned two things: she was pregnant, and her insurance had been cancelled. She tried to apply for Medicaid, but was denied. Not knowing where to turn, a coworker recommended Womankind. The colleague had used Womankind's services for her prenatal care when she was pregnant with her son and was confident the nonprofit could help Marissa.

When Marissa reached out to Womankind, she was crying and,



as she put it, "freaking out," but she was quickly put at ease. "Knowing that Womankind could provide my prenatal care and assist with Medicaid was a huge stress release. It was such a big help," she said.

As her pregnancy progressed, Marissa came to enjoy her visits to Womankind's Monday evening clinics, where she did not feel like a charity case. Chemarra Bryant, Womankind's Director of Counseling and Support Services, helped her cope with the stress of not having insurance and worked with her to get Medicaid approval. "The outpouring of love from everyone at Womankind made me feel comfortable so I could simply focus on having a healthy baby." she said.

Marissa left Chick-fil-A and used her degrees in art and math from the College of Wooster to pick up a part-time job teaching art at Lutheran West High School while she was still pregnant. She was blessed by how supportive her new employer was when she went into labor two and a half weeks early. Baby girl Everly entered this world weighing 5 pounds and 6 ounces, beautiful and healthy.

Marissa and husband Josh, a landscaper, hope to have more kids in the near future. For now, they are enjoying the wonder of every milestone in Everly's young life, like holding her head up, recognizing people, and even sleeping through the night. The couple couldn't wait to come back to Womankind to show off Everly, and even donated some of her infant clothes so they could help out other families in need.

Marissa says she makes sure she tells everyone she knows about Womankind. She exclaimed, "They were the best thing I never knew about. Without Womankind, I probably would have lost my sanity. They were a lifesaver!"

Hope, Help, Possibility and Life!

Womankind is focused on the health of mother and baby beyond pregnancy. We could not stand on the sidelines reading the statistics on infant mortality in Cuyahoga County without taking action. This is the reason we have partnered for years with the Ohio Department of Health's Cribs for Kids Safe Sleep Program.

According to First Year Cleveland, a community movement dedicated to eliminating infant mortality, "The infant mortality rate in Cuyahoga County is one of the highest in the United States. Of the 13,204 babies born in Cuyahoga County in 2020, 101 didn't make it to their first birthday."

We have a dedicated staff member, Julie Keller, who consistently provides education, tutorials and the distribution of Cribettes for families in need of a safe sleep option. We are humbled and grateful that we can make a difference in saving the lives of innocent babies. Beyond the births of babies, we want those same babies to live and thrive.

As she says it, "I researched what Womankind did, and I fell in love."

As Receptionist/Administrative Assistant, Mary's responsibilities include greeting our guests, answering the phone, scheduling pregnancy tests, baby item pick-ups and intakes, referring callers to needed services, and so much more!

Sharing a favorite personal experience at Womankind, Mary recalled the day a woman who found our information online came in for a pregnancy test. The woman was upset about the possibility of being pregnant since she had recently delivered a baby. Mary spoke to her with her inimitable compassion, assuring her of all the support and help Womankind provides. The woman was put at ease and wept with gratitude.

Mary is a retired teacher/administrator who has been married to her amazing husband for 45½ years. She has four grown children and eight grandchildren, who lovingly refer to her as "GG." She hosts formal tea parties for her "grandgirls" and their friends every year, teaching them life skills, as well as the annual week-long "Camp GG" for all of the grands.

Elizabeth Mattioli is a ray of sunshine on the Womankind team! Elizabeth joined Womankind as Staff Nurse following the untimely passing of former Director of Nursing, Nancy Pavlik. Like Mary, she started as a volunteer in response to a post on the Blessed is She Facebook page about needing volunteer RNs and help with phlebotomy. She says she was attracted to Womankind's mission and wanted to help women throughout their pregnancies.

Working with Nurse Manager, Erin Hopkins, Elizabeth is responsible for helping ensure that Monday evening clinics run smoothly, often doing phlebotomy at the clinics. During the week, she meets with new patients to prepare their medical histories, administers

pregnancy tests, documents lab results and is available to offer medical advice to women about their pregnancies.

Elizabeth says her favorite part about working at Womankind is meeting women where they are at in their pregnancy journey, and walking alongside them by providing medical care and emotional support. She gleefully exclaims, "I love being part of

the Womankind team and being able to care for women in need!"

Elizabeth knows the incredible impact of Womankind first-hand. Shortly after she started working at Womankind, she found out she was pregnant! With her husband being between jobs, she found herself in need of our services. In her words, "Womankind was there to help me from the beginning, offering free prenatal care and maternity clothes. I was extremely touched by the generosity and thoughtfulness demonstrated by my coworkers, and it allowed me to directly experience the impact that Womankind has on our patients!"

The Mattioli baby is due in July, and Elizabeth and husband Aaron couldn't be more excited to welcome this new life into the world. They currently share their home with an English Bulldog named Hippo.

When she arrived, Sister Peter signed her up for a two-week volunteer training class and the rest, as they say, is history. Dianne's volunteer journey started when she helped answer phones daily. She felt this was her "place of refuge." One day, she went to the back warehouse area and noticed elderly volunteer Gracie was working by herself. Gradually, she started helping Gracie, and was joined by another woman Doris. As time went by, and volunteers came and went, Dianne took charge of sorting donated baby items, developing a system of labeling the clothing and cubbies to simplify pulling orders, bringing that over to the "new" location when Womankind moved its offices to the building next door.

Today, Dianne heads up a Tuesday crew of loyal volunteers who keep the warehouse area stocked and organized. Dianne herself takes home clothes that need to be washed to make sure moms are given fresh items that are ready for the babies to wear. Now that's dedication!

Dianne says her favorite thing about volunteering at Womankind is the satisfaction of helping and making a difference in the lives of the clients we serve. She exclaims, "I love it! It's my home away from home."


2022 Demographics:






